

OBJECTIVES AND STRATEGIES

OBJECTIVE: Resolve the future of the I-81/I-77 overlap in as timely a manner as possible and in a manner most beneficial to Wythe County so as to permit the county and the Town of Wytheville to properly plan for growth and development.

STRATEGIES: Urge the Virginia Department of Transportation to implement the suggestions put forth in the joint resolution of April 2006 by the Wythe County Board of Supervisors, Wytheville Town Council, Rural Retreat Town Council, Joint Industrial Development Authority, and Wytheville-Wythe-Bland Chamber of Commerce.

Urge the Virginia Department of Transportation to construct a direct interchange from any newly designed section of I-81 directly into Progress Park.

Continue to plan for a steady increase of truck traffic on I-77 and I-81.

Actively participate in studies of the proposed I-74 to best determine its economic and physical impact on Wythe County.

OBJECTIVE: In the intermediate term, ensure adequate access to the interstate highways via existing exit 77 of I-81 and exit 41 of I-77.

STRATEGY: Work with the Virginia Department of Transportation to achieve sufficient and satisfactory improvements that will accommodate economic growth in Progress Park and other areas that use these exits.

OBJECTIVE: Ensure the viability of interstate exits located in Wythe County to handle increased future traffic.

STRATEGY: Encourage the county, or its towns as appropriate, to seek funding for traffic impact studies of the ability of county exits to accommodate increased traffic and proposed development.

OBJECTIVE: Encourage the improvement of other, non-interstate highways and roads in the county to best provide for the safety and convenience of county residents.

STRATEGIES: Prioritize unpaved road projects based on an established set of criteria.

WYTHE COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN, 4TH EDITION

Utilize the Rural Addition and/or Rural Rustic Roads Programs to pave existing secondary highways and improving secondary system of state highways to minimal state standards.

Study the condition of road and bridge infrastructure for potentially unsafe aspects such as dangerous curves, inadequate bridges, and inadequate pavement widths and include identified problems in the six-year secondary road plan for the county.

Support the widening, straightening, and improvement of VA 94.

Continue to upgrade substandard subdivision streets to state standards through the Rural Addition Program and cost sharing from property owners.

Request funding to provide crossing bars and safety devices for all remaining unprotected public rail grade crossings in the county.

Promote the replanting of trees and use of native species to improve the aesthetic value of roadways and to prevent erosion.

OBJECTIVE: Increase the availability of public transit, including passenger rail and bus services.

STRATEGIES: Support increased federal or state funding for the expansion of services by the District Three Governmental Cooperative to the county.

Promote efforts to restore passenger rail service through Southwest Virginia.

Encourage the continuation of passenger bus service to Wythe County.

Support the Mid-Term Project identified in DTPT TDP extended service hours and Saturday service on Wytheville routes and vision project to offer Saturday and additional service on Wythe County routes.

Support DTPT capital plan for replacement and expansion vehicles and for installation of bus stop signs, shelters and benches.

OBJECTIVE: Promote the availability of rail service to Wythe County industries.

STRATEGY: Support opportunities for greater industrial use of the railroad through the county.

WYTHE COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN, 4TH EDITION

OBJECTIVE: Support airport improvements to meet future needs of industry and the general public.

STRATEGIES: Support the phased development plan recommended in the Mountain Empire Master Plan, including the construction of an upgraded terminal building, T-hangers, navigational aids, other site improvements, and property acquisition.

Investigate the long-range feasibility of commuter air service based on experiences of other small airports.

Foster such conditions as promote the economic feasibility acquiring a fixed-base operator at Mountain Empire Airport.

OBJECTIVE: Encourage facilities for pedestrian and bicycle transportation.

STRATEGIES: Pursue opportunities to link Wytheville and Fort Chiswell with the New River State Park via a hiking/biking trail.

Continue to support the development of the New River Trail as a hiking, biking, and horseback trail.

Encourage efforts to create pedestrian-friendly walkways in the form of cultural or heritage paths in downtown Wytheville.

Encourage the construction of bike lanes on US 52/21 north and US 21 south to provide a linkage to the Jefferson National Forest and the Mount Rogers National Recreation Area.

GOAL

OBJECTIVE: Establishing a residence based Transportation Demand Management (TDM) program and strategies of promoting telework.

STRATEGIES: Establishing commuter outreach efforts.

STRATEGIES: Supporting long distance commute markets.

STRATEGIES: Coordinating with neighboring employment areas for outbound employment and integrating TDM into local planning. (A new TDM program could either be established within the Mount Rogers Planning District Commission or by expanding a neighboring commuter program such as Roanoke Ride

LAND USE AND DEVELOPMENT

GOAL

Wythe County has as its goal to promote the orderly development of the county and maintain a reasonable balance between urban and rural land uses.

OBJECTIVES AND STRATEGIES

OBJECTIVE: Provide for the orderly growth of the county through the adoption of a land use management plan.

STRATEGIES: Review the county subdivision ordinance (# 99-5) to determine if it reflects the objectives of the revised plan and revise if necessary.

Adopt a land use management plan that is consistent with the land use objectives, the Future Land Use Map, and the plans set forth in this *Wythe County Comprehensive Plan*.

Coordinate the land use management plan with the two towns in the county and reconcile with their respective ordinances.

Implement a public education program to inform county residents of the need for and benefits of a land use management plan.

OBJECTIVE: Promote quality, well-planned residential development in areas best suited for residential use. (See also the "Housing" section above.)

STRATEGIES: Encourage residential development in and around the county's two towns and higher-density areas or in areas served by public water and sewer.

Encourage the preservation of natural vegetation and terrain, as much as

practical, in residential site developments.

Encourage area builders to develop residential property to serve a diversity of income levels and housing types.

Incorporate the Manufactured Home Ordinance into the land use management plan when one is prepared for adoption.

Encourage well-planned and well-landscaped manufactured home parks that provide safe and sanitary housing and are located in areas with adequate water and sewer systems.

Provide for safe vehicular access to all residential developments.

Encourage the provision of redevelopment and housing authority services for all of Wythe County, in combination with or through the expanded focus of the Wytheville Redevelopment and Housing Authority.

OBJECTIVE: Preserve the quality of prime agricultural land and protect it from conflicting land uses. (See also the "Land and Government" section and the subsection on "Goals and Strategies for Agriculture" above.)

STRATEGIES: Continue support of agriculture- and conservation-related activities to ensure a sound environment and a healthy tax base for Wythe County's future.

Adopt a land use management plan as a means to protect natural resources and prevent over-development of stream valleys and mountain slopes.

Continue to enforce the current soil and erosion ordinance (# 82-1) to prevent the erosion and sedimentation effects of development.

Support and encourage the use-value taxation program as a voluntary means for the individual landowner to protect prime agricultural land.

Support and encourage the Agricultural-Forestal Districts program as a voluntary means for individual landowners to protect prime agricultural land and woodland resources.

OBJECTIVE: Protect the county's natural and cultural resource land from degradation and misuse. (See also the "Land and Government" section above.)

STRATEGIES: Consider the study and implementation of a water management plan.

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Designate flood plain areas as mapped by the Federal Emergency Management Agency on any land use management plan and restrict them from permanent development by enforcement of the Floodplain Management Ordinance (# 78-6).

Encourage the adoption of a storm water management plan.

Undertake a comprehensive survey of cultural and historic landmarks in Wythe County and preserve them through voluntary conservation easements and Virginia and national landmarks designations.

Enter into discussion with legislators on how to improve erosion and sediment control measures for silvaculture.

OBJECTIVE: Promote well-planned commercial and industrial development with adequate access and utilities. (See also various subsections under "Economy" above.).

STRATEGIES: Encourage planned commercial developments to locate at major intersections or in strategic "clustered" locations rather than linear "strip" development along highways.

Concentrate commercial and industrial development in growth areas where adequate water, sewer, roads, and other needed infrastructure exist or are planned.

Reserve appropriate land for industrial park development.

Consider multiuse functions of industrial park land such as recreation or child care facilities within the park.

Wythe County Parks and Recreation Department

Status Report – November 2014

- 1. JV Youth Basketball** – The County Parks and Recreation has joined with the Wytheville Parks and Recreation for JV Youth Basketball season. Together there are 4 boys teams and 6 girls teams. Games began on November 10th. Season tournaments will begin on December 9th.
- 2. Varsity Youth Basketball** - Registration has started and season will begin after new year
- 3. Ager Park, Max Meadows Ball Field and Rural Retreat Campground and Pool**- All Facilities have been winterized and are closed until the spring
- 4. Max Meadows Ball Field** – The Max Meadows Ruritan Club has offered to possibly pay for new lights to line the walking track at Max Meadows. Bill Vaughn, Rhonda Vaught and Kevin Williams met with AEP on Monday November 17th and they will work up the proposal on cost. We will then send the proposed cost and plan to the Max Meadows Ruritan Club to review. We should have a proposal prior to Thanksgiving.
- 5. Sheffey After-School Program** – With the grant awarded by the Wythe-Bland Foundation the parks and recreation department is moving forward with the after-school program. We will be advertising for a part-time position for a Program Director which will facilitate and oversee the program. The program is projected to start February 3rd 2015. Plans are to offer the program 3 days a week until the end of the school year. We will then have a second 12 week session of the program starting after Labor Day. Through the grant we will be able to fund the part time position plus buying supplies for the program. We have been in contact with Wytheville Community College and the Wythe-Bland Scholarship program to obtain volunteers to help facilitate the program.

The Parks and Recreation Department will also be writing policies and procedures for the program prior to the program to start. We will also be researching and planning activities for the program as well as buying materials for the program.

We will be looking into local area businesses to help with healthy snacks during the program.

The Parks and Recreation department has been in touch with the county Health Department as well as the 4-H agent to help plan activities.

- 6. Christmas Crafts Class** - This class will be offered on Saturday December 13th at the Rural Retreat Community Center. The class is \$20 and participants will leave with 3 separate crafts. The class will be taught by Ava Creger of the Paper Nest Studio.
- 7. Policies and Procedures** – During the winter months the Parks and Recreation Director will be reviewing, organizing, and revising policies and procedures for the department. We have found that most of the policies and procedures are scattered around and unorganized. Once the director has gathered information together we will then have the Recreation Commission to review and make recommendations.
